What are your go-to colors?

CHRIS GODDARD

I try to never use the same color twice, but every room needs a touch of black to ground the space.

KARA COX

I never tire of pale blue greens and greige. My favorite colors to accent with are citron green or coral.

ERIKA WARD

Any shade of blue, particular navy, will always be my go-to. It punctuates a room, much like black, but it is not as stark of a contrast when paired with white.

CHRIS HOLT Pale blues and whites.

MICHAEL HABACHY

I love colors, but tend to use them very sparingly. Most of my interiors tend to be layered in various shades of neutrals with a pop or two of color, depending on the mood that I am trying to create.

AMBER LEWIS

White, olive green, black.

CHAD JAMES

I tend to gravitate toward White Dove and Green Black. I love the element of juxtaposition.

KRISTIN KONG

I have some go-to colors that we tend to use more than others: Sherwin-Williams Black Fox, SW Functional Gray and SW Agreeable Grey. These "go-to" neutrals pair well with a multitude of color choices.

How did you earn your first paycheck?

I started designing windows for a store while in college, and a customer asked if I could help them with their bookcases. From there it just took off.

KARA COX

My first job was at a gift store in the local art gallery. I still love wrapping beautiful gifts.

AMBER LEWIS

My first paycheck was earned at a local drug store. It didn't last long!

KRISTIN KONG

Scooping ice cream! My first paycheck was from Häagen-Dazs where I fell in love with Belgian Chocolate ice cream.

MICHAEL HABACHY

Not sure if cash counts as a paycheck, but I was cutting neighbors' lawns with my father's lawnmower at the age of 12. I've always had an entrepreneurial spirit!

CHRIS HOLT

My first paycheck was earned at Benetton. To this day, I can fold a sweater like nobody's business.

ERIKA WARD

At 15 years old, I was armed with a work permit and a desire to make my own money. I got a job working at Macy's in Lenox Mall and was salesperson of the month! Imagine that.

WHAT'S HOT? (AND WHAT'S NOT?)

AMBER LEWIS

HOT: White after Labor Day.

NOT: Millennial pink ... SORRY!

KARA COX

HOT: Traditional style, with trims, fringe and layered design.

NOT: Overly formal living spaces; people want to use their whole house and not have a room that is just pretty to look at.

MICHAEL HABACHY

HOT: Goat-skin or parchment-clad furniture, blackened steel. Black is always a timeless and dramatic way to make a statement, but blackened steel especially creates a presence with its surface texture, subtle metallic reflection and heavy metal vibe.

NOT: Highly polished lacquered brass.

CHRIS HOLT

HOT: Rattan.

NOT: Anything Victorian.

KRISTIN KONG

HOT: Bolder and brighter hues, and mixing unusual color pairings, patterns and textures.

NOT: Too much brass, oversized furniture.

FRIKA WARD

HOT: Natural materials, statement lighting, anything made from alabaster or quartz, wall sculptures, trim molding, mixed kitchen cabinetry (i.e. wood and painted cabinetry in same kitchen)

NOT: Museum-like homes, carpet, generic lighting.

What's the first piece you like to begin a room design with?

AMBER LEWIS

Sometimes a piece of furniture, or a decorative item can be the inspiration for the entire home. I don't always start with furniture, though, sometimes we find a rug or a fabric and build from there.

KARA COX

I often start a room with a great piece of art or a one-of-a-kind rug.

CHRIS GODDARD

I start with the client's inspiration piece, such a piece of artwork, heirloom or favorite chair, and then build around it.

MICHAEL HABACHY

Ideally, it would be something special that means a lot to the client we are designing for. It could be a large painting, which would be a major focal point, or a luxurious rug. It is easy to pull a color palette together using complementary shades and hues when you have that as a starting point.

CHAD JAMES

Honestly, design always starts when the graphite meets the paper. It all begins with a drawing.

CHRIS HOLT

The first piece I like to design a room with is a rug or a fantastic printed fabric.

KRISTIN KONG

It could be anything ... an amazing fabric, rug or piece of art. There is no formula and we never know when inspiration will orbital.

ERIKA WARD

Fabrics are my jam. Fabrics are one of the most versatile design tools, in my opinion. Textures, pattern, color, and the hand of the fabric work together to evoke a particular mood.

Favorite AmericasMart destination showrooms?

I am a big believer in walking through every showroom on every floor. Just because the items in the window don't grab your attention doesn't mean there is not a hidden treasure inside.

What are the design "rules" you love to break?

MICHAEL HABACHY

I think breaking the rules in design is what sets you apart from all of the others out there. I love creating dark moody spaces which are believed to make a room feel small, but I feel quite the opposite. I also think it's fun to occasionally throw in a piece which is oversized and out of scale to make a statement.

KARA COX

By nature I am a rule-follower but one thing I love to do that is a little outside the lines is mixing eras of vintage art, furniture and accessories.

CHRIS HOLT

It's okay to mix it up. Old and new, high and low. Scale and proportion are always key. One rule I consistently break is that I love to overscale lighting fixtures. Go big or go home!

Rules are made to be broken. I love layering the unexpected—mixing the old with the new. A room should tell a story!
