DAUN CURRY: USE FABRIC INSTEAD OF PAPER

Designer Daun Curry turns to a traditional style of Japanese wrapping called *Furoshiki* for her gifts. "It's very easy to do and it makes it unique."

The style uses fabric that is tied around the gift instead of paper—a method that works great for presents of all shapes.



EASILY WRAP BOTTLES

"One of my favorite ways to bring a hostess gift to a party is bring a bottle of wine or champagne and take a piece of fabric and wrap it," says Curry.



USE JEWELRY AS ADORNMENTS

Curry collects vintage costume jewelry and uses pieces from her collection to embellish the packages. "Sometimes the hostess ends up wearing the jewelry, it's a cute thing and a conversation starter."



WRAP YOUR GIFT WITH A GIFT

"I love the sustainability of using a fabric instead of using paper," says Curry. She's had people use the fabric afterwards as scarves or used a scarf to wrap the present—giving a double gift.
