wanted something that was very bold and powerful, but also serene," designer David Hintgen of DH Interiors says of his color choice for this penthouse-apartment powder room, done for a 5,000-square-foot bachelor pad in the Four Seasons Residences in downtown Denver. Hintgen went for drama in each carefully chosen minimalist element: a walnut door with matching baseboard trim; cove LED lighting that makes the ceiling appear suspended in air; a pedestal sink from Vitraform made of mirrored bronze glass; an elegantly elongated toilet from Toto, echoing the oval of the sink; a limestone floor of silver travertine, cut into tiles forming a chevron pattern; and perhaps the nerviest

piece in the puzzle, a monochrome wallpaper from F. Schumacher & Co. with a rough, leathery shagreen texture (it's basically meant to be a synthetic form of sharkskin), in an intense shade of "Chinese orange." An elegant art-light bracket illuminates a photo-print by Danae Falliers, who specializes in post-processed shots of vast, flat, lonesome, and wide-open spaces like plains, prairies, deserts, and oceans.
