

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upper. It then requires incredible skill to bring that swan to life, especially when it includes gutting the house down to the studs, doubling the square footage and modernizing floor plans.

These major-scale renovations can be intimidating for even a seasoned veteran, but Designer Beth Daecher of [bd home design + interiors](#) saw the potential beauty in this house that hadn't been updated since the 1940s. What the house had going for it was its location in San Francisco's Glen Park neighborhood on the border of Noe Valley, a family-friendly neighborhood full of beautiful California Craftsman homes. The neighborhood features great parks and public transportation and is



the perfect choice for families that commute to Silicon Valley.





*“When I purchased this house, it was known as the ‘Pink Princess’ and had a pink facade with a crown on top that was not original to the home,” says Beth. “It was definitely a fixer-upper but it had the potential to be expanded into a good sized family home. The home had not been renovated since the 1940s—the kitchen featured laminate and formica and the bathrooms had very dated tile.*



*The project had a lot of potential to come back to an old house on the outside but a new house on the inside.*

*“There were many challenges for this remodel! The first was working with the architect to come up with a cohesive expansion from 1,500 square feet to 3,400 square feet. Since the house was a complete gut renovation, while we weren’t able to retain anything from the original house – except a beautiful stained glass window – we wanted to retain the spirit of the house while fitting in with the neighboring houses.”*





The home's contemporary aesthetic is immediately apparent in the entry which is located on the middle floor of the three story house. Wide plank oak flooring from Sweden and unique, sometimes handmade lighting are used throughout the home to enhance the modern tone.

*“My favorite space is the open plan kitchen/family room which incorporates many of my favorite design features: kitchen island for casual grazing and/or socializing, a built-in bench for casual dining close to the kitchen and family room, a seating area around a cozy fireplace, and lastly a desk in the middle of the action for mom to use while kids play or for kids to use for homework.”*






The wide doors which open fully to an ample deck flood the great room with light and create an indoor / outdoor living space.
