

MARTIN GROUP CONFERENCE ROOM


Beth Martin aimed to evoke the casual California lifestyle, as well as accommodate a range of activities, with her design of the conference room. Her pro bono efforts included serving as the design co-chair of the Where Hope has a Home project, and she was the beneficiary of myriad donations, including chairs from Lee Industries, Silestone for the tables and counters from Cosentino, wallpaper from Elizabeth Dow, and cabinetry from Poggenpohl.

EJ INTERIOR DESIGN GUEST ROOM

Eugenia Jesberg describes her design as "a true team effort, for a very meaningful cause. My goal was to create welcoming, comfortable rooms that evoke the feeling of being somewhere relaxing."

Serena & Lily donated much of the furniture, rugs and accessories;
Elan Evans painted the walls;
Susan Lind Chastain fabricated and installed the window coverings; and Catlin Weatherill sewed the bedding. For textiles, Jesberg turned to a designer favorite: Osborne & Little.





MONOGRAM DECOR GUEST ROOM

For his suite, designer Courtney Lake went well beyond scouring stores and showrooms; he consulted with pediatric nurses and family therapists. "The key takeaway was that the families don't come to the House because they want to be here - they have to be here," he says. Lake started with a soft and neutral palette, featuring shades of green, and was restrained in his design - letting the family inject personal touches for familiarity and comfort (for instance, adding photos on a special bulletin board).

MARTIN GROUP RECREATION ROOM

"This is the fun room in the house – where movie night happens, birthday parties are thrown or maybe a dance class takes place," says Beth Martin. FLOR was responsible for the carpet tiles, Arana Craftsman Painters took care of the paint as well as the painting, while the textiles for the custom block-printed Stargazer drapery came courtesy of Michelle Pereira.
