

#### Who is the woman you most look up to as a role model and inspiration in life?

**KW**: Achieving balance is always tough. I am a mother and wife first. I truly love what I do for a living and I want to instil that passion and work ethic in my boys. At times, everything feels like a juggling act. My studio houses many different disciplines under one roof — from furniture to jewellery to interior design. The common thread is passion and love. It fuels everything. Doing what you love every day and putting the people you love first is a recipe for gratitude and fulfilment.
