For those drawn to the sea, having a house on the water in Malibu is a dream come true. The stunning views and the ethereal sounds of the Pacific Ocean make it one of the most desirable waterfront communities to call home.

Located in southern California, Malibu has a temperate climate, beautiful beaches, and proximity to Hollywood, making it highly sought after for both celebrities and surfers alike. There are twenty-one miles of beautiful sandy beaches, most of which are open to the public.

Architect and designer Jamie Bush was given the task of designing the interiors and finishes for his client's home overlooking the ocean. Although the house had a modern overall design, Jamie incorporated visual and tactile textures to give the spaces a warmer feel. The goal was to design a home that would be comfortable and casual, while maximizing the view of the Pacific Ocean and the beaches below.

The color selection throughout reflects the muted palette of seaside living, with inspiration taken from sand and driftwood. Some of floors are planked with travertine tile, and, to define different spaces, the walls transition from a smooth white to a graywashed board and batten with a ceruse finish that brings out the grain.

There is a seamless flow from the indoor spaces onto the deck, thanks to a glass wall that disappears. The interior travertine floors seem to blend perfectly onto the teak deck that is cantilevered over the hill. Glass and metal rails that define the outdoor spaces ensure an unobstructed view of the sea below.

Centered in the living room is a custom bleached coffee table by

The kitchen has a disappearing wall that opens to the outdoor deck and views of the Pacific Ocean. The oak cabinetry is finished with a gray stain, and the countertops are granite.
