



Where Hope Has a Home

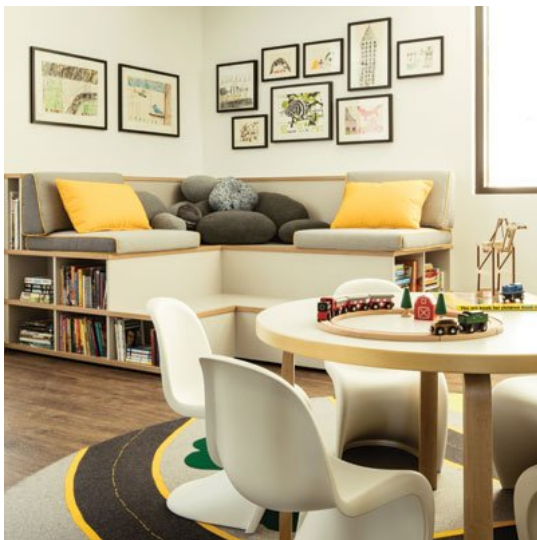
