


## Southern Style BEAUTIFUL HOMES PRESENTED BY SOUTHERN LADY\*











This historic home in the heart of Buckhead in Atlanta was designed by renowned New York architect Aymar Embury II, whose limited Southern work includes Mountain Brook Country Club in Birmingham. Designer Meridy King grew up just a couple of streets down from this house. She says she loves to see the older homes in the area restored to their "original look and shine." Though the home was still beautiful on the outside, Meridy says, its interior was a tragic tribute to the '80s. They traded the taupe walls and dated furnishings for a lighter, brighter feel throughout. A stunning chandelier in the living room became the catalyst for a nearly exclusive use of antique lighting in the rest of the residence.













At the start of the process, Meridy recalls telling owners Barbara and Julian Sparkes, "Whoever does this house needs to respect it and bring it back to what it used to be." The dining room is original to the home, but it has been updated with pieces that support an aura of timeless elegance. "We made the old lighting and some of the antique furniture feel young and new," Meridy explains. "It still feels current." In addition to her efforts to stay true to the home's inherent formal feel, she also had to consider the couple's three children. "I had to take this very fine home and make it livable, childproof, and comfortable," Meridy says. "I went in with all of that in mind and just tried to make it a home that would not go out of style."
















"What makes this home unique is the architecture," Meridy says. "It's not the design of a home you would build today."
