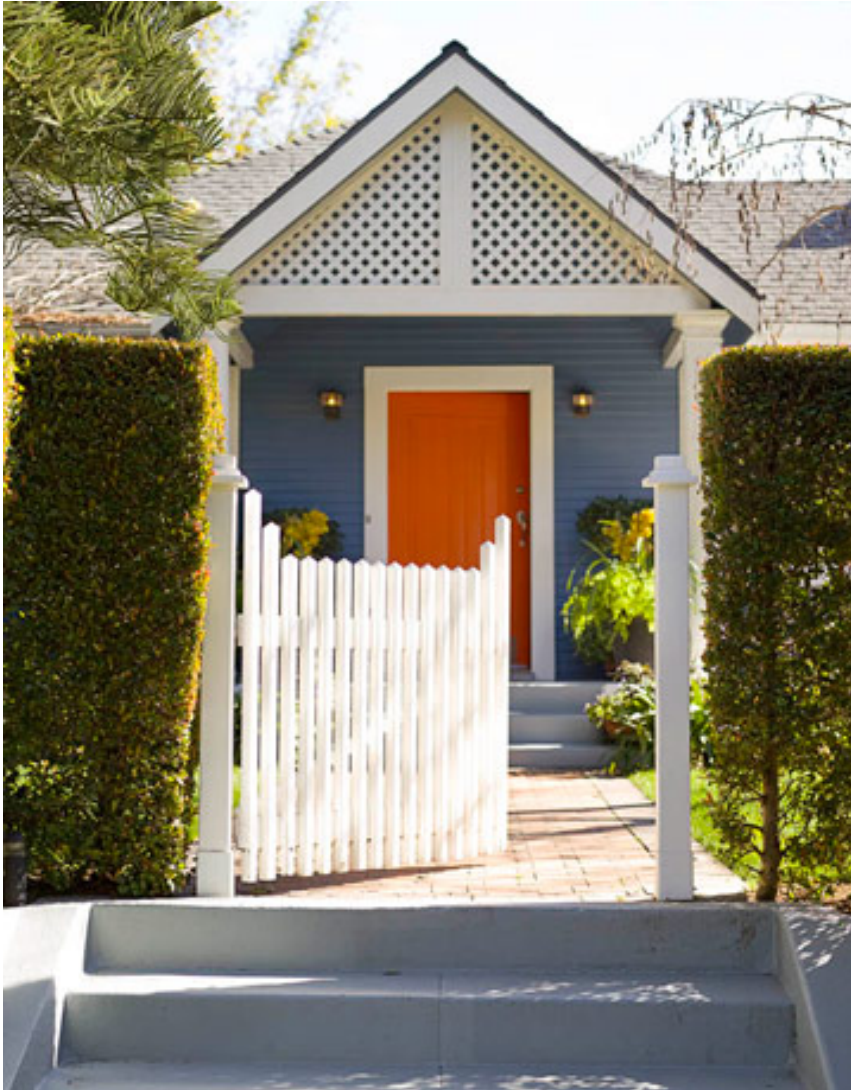


## A Worldly Los Angeles Living Room
