

Many remodeling projects operate with the mind-set

that more really is better. But a thoughtful design solution that doesn't upend every square inch can yield enviable results. Take the California kitchen of Lisa and Chris Hauswirth: It functioned just fine but was closed off and dark. "The existing kitchen was super traditional with tons of heavy cabinetry," architectural designer Sarah Reeves of Sazen Design says. Despite all the cabinets, the kitchen lacked the size and scale of storage space the Hauswirths required. But all of that changed with a remodel that repurposed a nearby bathroom andshockingly-didn't require moving any walls. Reeves and Nancy Madynski at builder Jeff King & Co. instead focused on minimal moves, and designers from Decorist incorporated style updates that complemented the home's original architectural elements.

The design team carefully analyzed proportions and traffic flow in the kitchen, moving the sink and dishwasher to strengthen the room's work space. A long, linear island was replaced by a shorter, wider version with seating-the command center for the busy household. A new wood desktop faces a bank of windows, which often serves as Lisa's sunny work space and offers additional seating for get-togethers. An added doorway into the kitchen enables easy access to the new butler's pantry across the hallonce a rarely used bathroom. The homeowners now enjoy an abundance of storage and extras, such as a wine fridge and prep sink in the pantry.

Materials choices also lightened and brightened the hardworking space. A streamlined vent hood recedes into the bank of upper cabinets, while two sets of open shelves contribute to a light, airy feel. An organically inspired tile mosaic backsplash offers design interest above the range. Matte-brass accents, including cabinet knobs and pendant lights, supply a bit of glam. Walnut shelves and whitewashed oak flooring offer contrast to the cooler tile, stone, and stainless steel as well as the white and light gray custom cabinets.

Lisa is shocked by "how dramatic the transformation was," she says. "The design team didn't just bring our vision to life, they made our vision better."
